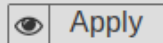
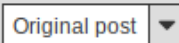

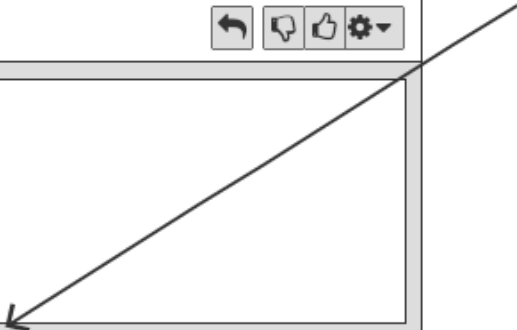

Forks can be displayed this way. Now user switched to the red fork from the main blue discussion



The blue stipe is the main thread, it is treated the same way other branches are treated

We can show all the comments in the thread until the one user chose to reply to. To show that this comment is actually not the last one we can show the breach in the thread line. Then, clicking on the little blue stripe will take user to the thread again the same way if he clicks to any other stripe

In a tooltip we can show an identifier of the object we are replying, or the author, or even some few words from his message

This option of "new reply" isn't among this comboboxes options. To enter this mode you need to find the comment you want to reply and then click on reply button

There might be the situation when a comment is replied to some other comment which hasn't yet been received. We can consider them as orphans for now and in case we ever fetch the parent message we will weave it under parent.
